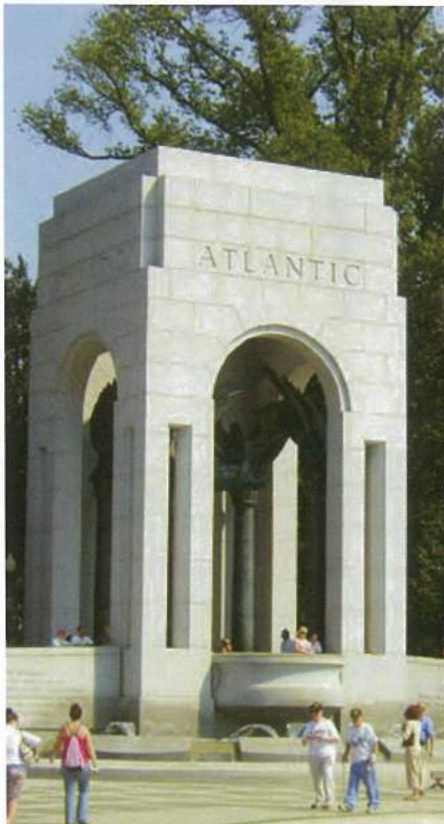

OUR MISSION

The Honor Flight Network and Honor Flight Quad Cities work tirelessly to fly America's veterans to Washington, D.C. to visit those memorials dedicated to honoring their sacrifices. Top priority is given to America's most senior veterans – survivors of WWII – followed by Korean War veterans and any veterans with a terminal illness who wish to visit THEIR memorial.





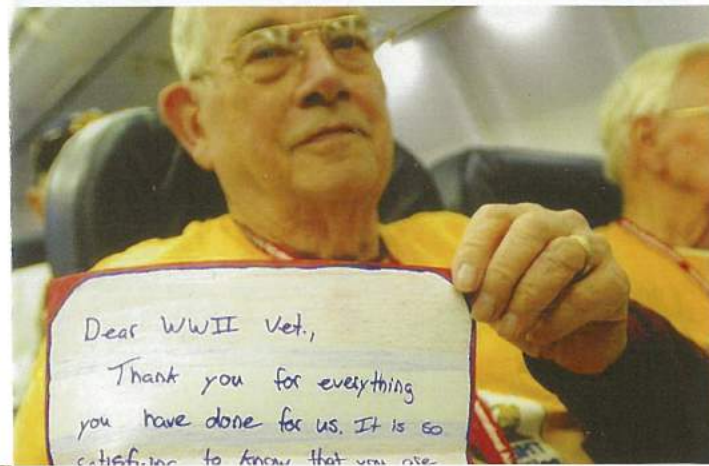
We have safely transported close to 2,500 veterans on 26 flights as guests of Honor Flight Quad Cities.

To assist disabled veterans, Honor Flight Quad Cities provides oxygen and wheelchairs as needed. The flights, deluxe tour bus service, tee shirts, jackets, books, wheelchairs, oxygen, meals, and other amenities are provided FREE to our Veterans.

On this day, President Bush dedicated the World War II Memorial to honor "The Greatest Generation." Regrettably, very few of these veterans have the funds or physical stamina to complete a conventional trip to Washington, D.C. on their own.

It is our intention to honor as many of these selfless "ordinary people who saved the world" as we can by providing them a FREE trip to visit their memorial. Our program operates on donations from organizations and individuals. We also provide trained "guardians" who personally escort the veterans on the aircraft and accompany them to the memorials throughout the day. Guardians pay their own way. *Medical attendants are NOT provided.*



Every veteran deserves to visit his or her memorial. Our Honor Flight hub is determined to accomplish this mission as long as funding and volunteers are available. The terminally ill and WWII Veterans are our top priority, followed by Korean Veterans who wish to visit their memorial.

Our flying season is April through early November. During the winter months we continue to expand our operations by conducting fundraising and educating the public.

As we organize, develop and grow, we ask for the Lord's blessings of wisdom, safe travel and good health for the veterans and guardians.

• Spread The Word
